



The Cathedral Organ is played at all our principal services. The original instrument, built by T C Lewis of London, was shipped to New Zealand in 1871, with a rebuild in 1968 to form the present organ. Placed in a free-standing chamber designed by the Cathedral architect, the organ contains 2481 speaking pipes, which includes all of the original

pipes. The raised 3-manual and pedal console is on the right of the chancel.

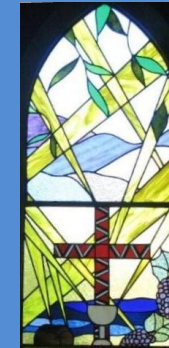
